It was also a valuable opportunity to reflect on areas we can continue to develop in the future. As always, our children's behaviour and confidence were highlighted and praised. LOCKDOWN PROCEDURES

As part of our commitment to keeping everyone safe, we do an annual lockdown practice. At the start of the week, the children are informed that a drill will take place—but not exactly when. When the alarm sounds

(a bell rung five times), everyone moves quickly to the nearest room. Blinds are closed, doors are locked, and I carry out a check to ensure all areas are secure. Afterwards, we take time to reflect and discuss any issues that may have arisen. I would like to commend our children for their mature and calm response during the drill. Staff were also highly conscientious, ensuring procedures were followed carefully. Please note: if a lockdown were ever to occur during drop-off or pick-up times, we ask that parents enter the nearest room immediately. This allows us to keep the entire school community as safe as possible.

HEALTHY SNACKS

- Snacks must be items your child can manage independently. For example, please avoid anything that requires adult help to open or prepare.
- Snacks will be stored in classrooms, usually in children's trays or bags.

As we all adjust to this new approach, we'll communicate with you about any snacks that may not meet the updated guidelines. We're confident this new policy will support our pupils' learning, concentration, and overall wellbeing.
